The Valley Springs Community Plan was approved unanimously Tuesday by the Calaveras County Board of Supervisors.

Plagued in controversy over the past decade, the compromise plan sailed through the board action with no public comment.

"Peter (Planning Director Maurer) and your staff, thank you so much for all the hard work over the many, many years," District 1 Supervisor Gary Tofanelli said in making the motion to adopt the plan.

The majority of the plan covers his district. The second to Tofanelli's motion was made by District 5 Supervisor

Benjamin Stopper. A small portion of his district is within the plan.
