The first phase of the improvement project is expected to go out to bid shortly and construction on the north side of the intersection could begin at the end of summer or beginning of fall, according to Jonathan Mitchell, senior engineer for the county's public works department.

This first phase of work will include pedestrian access and accessibility improvements, he said.

The bulk of the intersection improvement project would be in phase two. It will include right-ofway acquisition, final design and of three alternatives presented to
construction.
Funding for the second phase begins near the end of the year and working with landowners to obtain the necessary right-of-way could start in early 2013 and typically is about a six-month process, Mitchell said.

Although there is no set tion. timeline, if the right-of-way acquisition process runs smoothly, final phase construction could begin at about this time next year, Mitchell added.

The proposed project consists of a free right turn lane from northbound SR 26 onto eastbound SR $12 / 26$ and a left turn lane from westbound SR12 to SR26.
