Fact vs. Fiction about the asphalt plant (quotes from proponent flyer "Get the facts"):

"DFW has no concerns." FICTION.

FACT: The Department of Fish & Wildlife is **VERY concerned** about an asphalt plant near the Calaveras River. According to Warden Ryan Hanson, "**Environmental concerns must be addressed**"; there will not be a pollution event "**if they follow the permit requirements.**"

"The Plant will not create any significant new traffic." FICTION.

FACT: Asphalt plant production **WILL increase truck traffic**. Peak Asphalt Plant production (3,000 tons/day) will generate **120-150 new asphalt trucks per paving shift—in addition to other aggregate and rock customers**. That's **one toxic truckload every 4 minutes** for a 10-hr. shift!
