#### WHAT IS BEING PLANNED?

Calaveras County, in coordination with the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), proposes to rehabilitate and strengthen the Calaveritas Road Bridge (Bridge Number 30C-0024) over Calaveritas Creek. Caltrans has determined that the bridge is structurally deficient. As a result, the bridge has been recommended for rehabilitation. The proposed project would rehabilitate and strengthen the existing bridge over Calaveritas Creek to provide an improved local transportation facility. The bridge is located just south of the town of Calaveritas, Calaveras County.

for the Sawmill Lake development, but did not convince the commission to change the proposed land use designation for the former Copper Valley project area.

Although the Calaveras Planning Coalition submitted extensive written comments, and had many people speak on each day of the hearing, the commission refused most of the general plan improvements offered by the CPC. Furthermore, the commission refused to address CPC concerns regarding the inadequacy of the Final Environmental Impact Report. Despite approximately 30 minutes of public testimony asking for the commission to take 21 specific actions to correct the county's responses to comments on the DEIR, the commission was silent on the subject. Despite a CPC memo and
